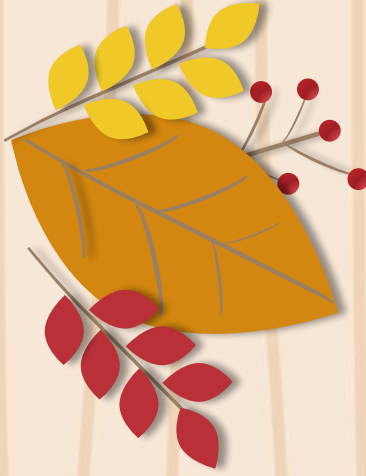


# Happy Thanksgiving
