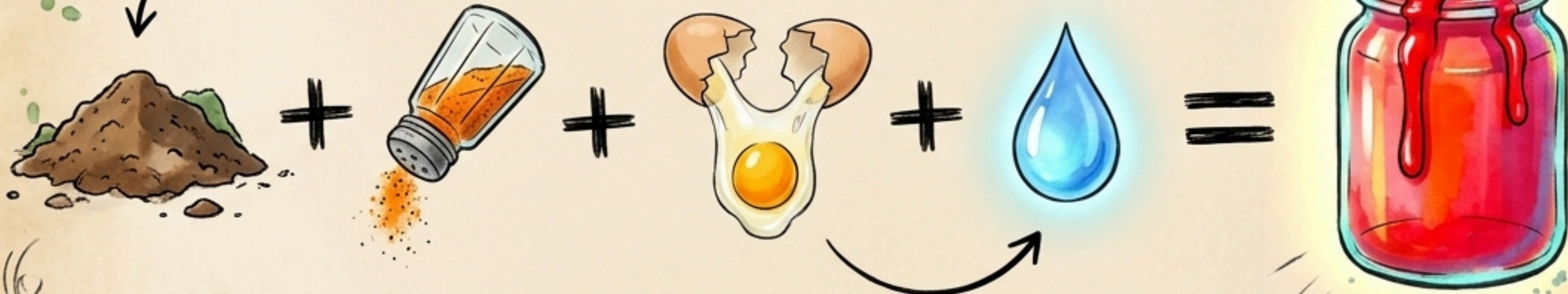
We will paint with treasures from the sea and the field.
