
Let's remember!

Adverbs of frequency in English: often, never, sometimes and always.



Where do adverbs of frequency go?

Adverbs of frequency show you how often something happens. This can be always = 100%, or never = 0%.

- always
- often
- sometimes
- never

These adverbs can go before the main verb.

Subject	Auxiliary	Adverb of frequency	Verb	Rest
1		always	get up	at 6.45.
Peter	can	usually	play	football on Sundays.
Mandy	has	sometimes	got	lots of homework.

or after a form of to be (am, are, is) - (was, were).

Subject	Auxiliary	Adverb of frequency	Rest
Susan	is	never	late.

The adverbs often, usually, sometimes and occasionally can go at the beginning of a sentence.

- · Sometimes I go swimming.
- . Often we surf the internet.

Sometimes these adverbs can go at the end of a sentence.

· We read books occasionally.
